

Church Leadership Needs For 2011

Administrative Council Members:

Members of the church are needed to be part of our Administrative Council. The council meets every other month usually on the third Tuesdays at 7pm. The council deals with the visioning, planning, oversight for the ministry of the church. This is a three year commitment with fifteen hours annually worth of work.

Pastor Parish Relations Committee:

The PPRC meets quarterly and has special meetings if needed. They deal with staffing issues, setting of the pastor's compensation, and evaluation of staff. This commitment is for three years, you must be a member of the church to serve, and it requires about ten hours worth of work annually.

Lay Member to Annual Conference:

The L.MAC attends Annual Conference every year. It is held the second or third week in June from Thursday to Sunday. The L. MAC also reports to the congregations the decisions of the Annual Conference. The L. MAC serves on the church council, on the finance committee, and on the PPRC. This is a three year term, you must be a member of the church to serve, and requires about 25 hours worth of work plus Annual Conference on an annual basis.

Finance Committee:

This committee meets about six times a year. It deals with all the financial issues of the church from formulating the annual budget to running the stewardship campaign. Members of this committee are also encouraged to be Sunday counters. This is a three year commitment that requires about 15 hours worth of work on an annual basis.

Board of Trustees:

This committee meets about ten times a year, usually on the first Tuesday of the month at 7:15pm. The committee is in charge of all the real property of the church. They deal a lot with hands on type of issues and on planning for future structural maintenance and enhancements. This commitment is for three years and requires about 40 hours worth of work annually.

Education Committee:

This committee meets as needed but on average about five times a year. It is in charge of all the education programs of the church. This includes Sunday school, Bible Studies, and small groups. This commitment is for three years and on average requires about twelve hours worth of work annually.

Membership Nurture and Care Committee:

This committee meets as needed and usually five times a year. They see to it that the members of the church keep in contact with each other no matter their situation in life. They look after the shut-in's, college students, and those serving in the military. They see to it that the prayer chain is well organized and that new members are welcomed into the church. This commitment is for three years and on average requires about ten hours worth of work.

Fellowship Committee:

This committee meets as needed and usually five times a year. They are in charge of the fellowship gatherings of the church. Examples of these events are the weekly fellowship time on Sunday's and annual events like Heritage Sunday. This commitment is for three years and requires about ten hours of worth of work.
